The Wright Brothers

The Wright brothers, **Orville Wright** and **Wilbur Wright**, invented, built and flew the world's first successful motor-operated airplane.

The Wright Flyer

The Wright Flyer made the first flight on December 17, **1903**. The Wright Brothers flew it in an area called **Kitty Hawk, North Carolina**. The airplane flew 260m on its fourth and final flight.

Neil Armstrong

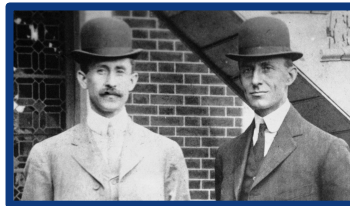
Neil Armstrong was an **American astronaut** and aeronautical engineer who, on the 20th July 1969, became the first man to walk on the moon.

The Moon Landing

The United States' **Apollo 11** was the first crewed mission to land on the Moon, on 20 July **1969**.

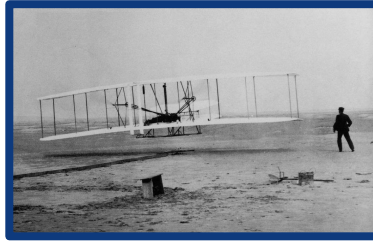
